



Forum Board of Directors Highlights from March 2022 Call



- Guest Presentations:
 - QIP/PPS 2022 Proposed Rule & KFC/CKCC Application Update (A. Howard)
 - Framework for Alliance Building: Kidney Transplant Collaborative, PCORI project on treating depression (L. Diamond/D. Forfang)
 - CEC/ESCO Final Report (R. Atkinson)

- Forum investments and donations continue to be a funding source for the organization.
- Forum received \$5000 grant through PCORI to support the dissemination of Evidence Updates related to treating depression in patients with kidney disease. The Forum has proposed 3 activities to help promote the PCORI Evidence Updates:
 - 1. <u>Patient-perspective piece</u> summarizing KPAC members' participation in study and their experiences related to mental health and kidney disease.
 - 2. <u>Podcast</u> on the topic of mental health in dialysis patients to bring awareness to the topic and offer resources for patients, including the PCORI Evidence Updates and the KPAC Depression Toolkit.
 - 3. Partnering with the ESRD Networks, the KPAC will host a <u>community webinar</u> on the topic of mental health in dialysis patients, annual depression screening, and treatment options.





Updates from EDAC Leadership:

- Networks have received the fully executed contract modification and the OY1 contract. Annual evaluations are expected in April.
- Updates on QIAs and outcomes to-date
- During the February Office Hours call, Networks shared innovations they have used to help lessen the burden on facilities during the COVID PHE. This was well-received by CMS and provided an opportunity for increased interaction with CMS leadership.

Forum / CMS Communications Ist Quarter 2022



- Dr. John J. Sim shared findings from the Kaiser Permanente data system pertaining to COVID infections in the kidney CKD and ESRD populations.
- Dr. Jeffrey Perl, Dr. Ronald Pisoni, and Lauren Kane present an overview of the Optimizing Prevention of PD-Associate Peritonitis in the US (OPPUS) project.
- Presentation from CDC (P. Patel & A.C. Bardossy) re: new recommendations for COVID-19 vaccine boosters; questions sent to CDC via CMS re: COVID vaccination guidelines were addressed by CDC leaders
- Inquired about the status of the OIG Audit of Networks concerning their COVID-19 response. Ms. Quinn reported they are finalizing the report and will share when complete.



COVID Communication Continues



- Forum leadership continued to bring COVID priorities and concerns to CMS during monthly CMS/Forum leadership calls. Forum leaders provided updates on:

 - COVID positivity rates among kidney patients

 - Staffing shortages, shift reductions, and facility closures

COVID Shortages Surveys



- CMS continued to work with ASPR, which is corresponding with manufacturers to identify the specific reasons for the shortages. CMS will share a summary of their findings and recommendations.
- Forum survey re: dialysis supply and staffing shortages (Jan 2022)
 - ~65% of respondents reported challenges securing dialysis supplies, with acid concentrate, CRRT fluid, and bicarbonate in critical shortage.
 - >95% of respondents reported nursing shortages; >84% reported PCT shortages. Many also reported shortages of LPNs, social workers, and dietitians.
 - The average % of usual RN and Technician staffing reported was about 70%, with several facilities reported operating at below 70%. >55% of facilities reported having to alter the number of shifts due to staffing issues.
 - Follow-up survey sent to those reporting supply shortages to gather information about specific products and manufacturers; results shared with CMS.




