

Network Accomplishments



2017 Project Highlights

- Reduced Network average LTC to 14.5% from baseline of 15.8% as of September 2017 (-1.3%)
- Increased Transplant Referrals from 13.2% at Baseline to 32.3% in Sept 2017 (+19.1%)
- Increased Home Dialysis Referrals from 8.1% at Baseline to 36.2% in Sept 2017 (+28.1%)
- Reduced Disparities in Home Dialysis Referrals by 4.4%
- Increased Hep B vaccinations in September to average 66.6% (+17%) (Hep B Baseline was 49.6%)
- Increased Average Pneumococcal vaccination in September to 65.1% (+25%) Baseline was 39.8%;

Technical Expert Panel (TEP) Representation & Participation



Ambulatory Surgical Center (complete)

KPAC Rep reported that opioid abuse will be included in the risk measure. The summary related to general surgery has been released for public review

Network 5 Pathways / Palliative Care TEP

KPAC Rep reported that she has been responding to emails, providing feedback in terms and process. The Texas Kidney Foundation has contacted NW5 to see if they would present the Pathways Project at the next TKF Symposium 2018.

ESRD Medication Reconciliation TEP (complete)

The recent discussions included disagreements about whether medication dosage should be listed or just the medication. KPAC members agreed dosage should also be included; SME will share this KPAC perspective with the TEP.

 Quality Measure Development: Supporting Efficiency and Innovation in the Process of Developing CMS Quality Measures

KPAC Rep was accepted to this TEP. The first in-person meeting was October 16th in Baltimore. Second meeting January 18th. Next two meetings, May and August 2018.

NQF Patient Reported Outcomes TEP "Patients Like Me" (complete)



Technical Expert Panel (TEP) Representation & Participation



- Emergency Department Visit TEP (complete)
 - Discuss the co-morbidity analysis to the ESRD measures.
- NQF Emergency Department Quality of Transitions of Care (complete)
 - Primary concern of the group is the lack of information getting back to the dialysis facility (and in a timely manner) after an emergency department visit.
- National Committee for Quality Assurance TEP, IMPAQ quality of life measures concepts for the ESRD Care Model using the Kidney Disease Quality of Life Survey (complete)
 - CMS is now using this TEP as guidance for future projects.
- Dialysis Facility Compare Star Rating TEP (complete)
 - At this time, only 6 of the measures from the ICH-CAHPS survey will be included. Only those facilities with >30 survey responses will be included so it is important to educate patients on the importance of completing and returning their ICH-CAHPS surveys, so their facility data can be included in the site. CMS plans to evaluate new measures in the future.
- UM-KECC Review existing Patient-Reported Outcomes measures & recommendations for development TEP (complete)
 - TEP settled on Patient Life Goals as driver for Care Plan and Feeling Safe in your Dialysis Facility (Feeling Safe, possibly used in Dialysis Compare)

KPAC 2017-2018 CDC Collaboration Update



- KPAC Chair attended the CDC Making Dialysis Safer Coalition
 Meeting on September 7th in Atlanta. Two projects for 2018 were
 selected in breakout sessions.
- The first 2018 subcommittee project will focus on Policy to Practice, improving care for catheters, dressings, training patients to care for their own catheters, and standardizing infection prevention policy, and facility adherence. We have had two meeting so far, more to come. (KPAC member Stephanie Dixon)
- The second 2018 subcommittee project is on Patient Engagement. The first kickoff meeting was held January 19th.






Innovative Alternatives to Renal Replacement Therapy (RRT): Developing a Roadmap

Patients with Kidney Failure Have Poor Outcomes Mortality rate is comparable to that of many cancers

5 Year Survival of Cancers and ESRD(by treatment)12



Quality of life is poor.

Personal financial costs and societal burden of kidney failure requiring dialysis or transplantation are high and unsustainable.²³

- \$345 is spent by lifedicare treating these patients
 7% of ALL Medicare expenditures
 All Medicare lidney patient costs \$163 billion

It is no longer enough to keep people alive

does not allow them to live a normal life.

Dialysis patients are often so sick*

- impacts self-management Vicious cycle with higher morbidity and mortality rates

Challenges remain despite incremental improvements in RRT

- · Advances in RRT have not matched technological developments in other areas, i.e. insulin pumps. pharmacogenomics, computers, cell phones.
- · Dialysis is intrusive to the patient and impacts their autonomy and quality of life
- Maintaining vascular access remains a problem
- · Knowledge gaps exist in basic kidney science

KPAC KHI Engagement



Convene adverse group of stakeholders patients and care partners, academics, industry and regulators. Describe scientific, technical, reimbursement, and regulatory dialenges for mechanical, cellular and hybrid technologies. Create a set of design criteria for future alternatives to RRT. Identify ways to incorporate patien preferences and feedback on design features. Create a roadmap with milestones and opportunities for creating abioengineered alternative to dialysis.






Are you familiar with the ESRD Network's role to assist with grievances?






Do you think patients in your facility feel safe **s** speaking up about concerns or complaints?


