DESCRIPTION & OUTCOMES: The Berkshire Medical Center conducted a full-scale emergency drill including dialysis staff and community partners (police, fire dept, ambulances, emergency department, etc.), and volunteer mock patients.

EXPLAIN WHY THE PROJECT/ACTIVITY IS A HIGHLY EFFECTIVE PRACTICE: The activity will optimally help dialysis staff be prepared in case of a true emergency and will help community partners who participate in the drill to understand the needs of dialysis patients and their unique circumstances and will help to coordinate with dialysis staff. In addition, dialysis staff will learn invaluable lessons from full scale drills involving community partners that would not be easily evident with mock or table-top drills. In the event of a true emergency, dialysis staff needs to be prepared and ready to respond quickly, and learning from full-scale drills will help them to be optimally prepared.
